New Bus Service

The Wisbech bus service project has designed a new service that reflects what people have told us are their local travel needs. The new service will provide transport to Tesco on Cromwell Road and other key destinations locally.

We are extremely pleased to announce the new service will start on **Monday 3rd July** and it will be operated by The Fenland Association for Community Transport

The new route will include a number of additional bus stops. Posts for the some of the new stops have already been installed along Ramnoth Road, Weasenhams Lane and South Brink.

The new service will start at 09:30 and run throughout the day. It will operate Monday to Saturday and stop within easy reach of these destinations:

- Rosmini Community Centre
- Queen Mary Centre
- Thomas Clarkson Academy
- College of West Anglia
