Title	OUTCOME OF CONSULTATION ON HACKNEY CARRIAGE PROPOSED TARIFFS	

1. PURPOSE/SUMMARY

This report gives Members the outcome of the recent consultation on the review of hackney carriage tariff charges and asks Members to consider the content of this report together with the comments submitted during the consultation period of 21 March 2012 to 3 April 2012 (14 days).

2. KEY ISSUES

- Request from Taxi trade for an increase in taxi tariff.
- Last tariff increase was the 25 April 2011.
- Local Authorities have a power to set fares for hackney carriages under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.
- Statutory consultation ended on 3 April 2012
- The Council has received five objections to the proposed changes to the taxi tariff as outlined in the Table of Fares.
- The Table of Fares is to come into force with or without modification, as decided, by 2 May 2012.

3. RECOMMENDATIONS

(1) To approve or refuse the Table of Fares taking into consideration this report and the responses received during the consultation period.

1 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The fare structure currently in place was set by Members on 25 April 2011 and showed an increase over the previous tariff of 5.462%.
- 1.2 The proprietor of Fenland Taxis wrote to the Council in an email outlining a proposal for an increase of tariff for 2012/13. The proposal outlined three different tariffs plus additional scaled charges for large taxis.
- 1.3 On the 2 March 2012 Licensing Committee decided to approve an increase in the tariff and the proposed tariff went out for consultation from 21 March 2012 to 3 April 2012 (14 days).
- 1.4 Alongside the formal Notice of the proposed changes, an article was placed in 'The Fenlander weekly on 23 March 2012. The article outlined the proposed changes and directed readers to the Council website for more information including an article on 'How Taxi Meters Work'. Response forms for the consultation were available for downloading from the website and copies were available from any of the four Fenland@your service shops or from Business Reception at Fenland Hall.
- 1.5 During the consultation period the Council received five responses. The Schedule of Responses may be viewed at **Appendix A** to this report.

2 LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 2.1 The authority for the Council to fix fares for hackney carriages is given under Section 65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976. The Act states that:
 - a) When a Council makes or varies a table of fares (which may be by time and/or distance), it must publish in a least one local newspaper a notice setting out the table of fares, or variations to the table, specifying the period (not less than 14 days) within which, objections to the table, or variations can be made.
 - b) A copy of the proposed tariff must be available at the Council's offices for the public to inspect, free of charge, at all reasonable hours.
 - c) If there are no objections, the table, or variation, will come into effect on the expiration date of the period specified in the notice.
 - d) If there are objections the Council must set a further date, within two months after that date first specified, on which the table is to come into force with or without modification, as decided. The Table of Fares must be in place by 2 May 2012.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The cost of re-calibrating individual meters will be met by individual hackney carriage proprietors and the meters will then be sealed by Licensing Officers. This is a normal part of the work undertaken by Officers and, although it may take two or three days of concentrated activity, it does not present an unrecognised resource implication.

3.2 The cost of the seals used to secure the individual meters once they have been calibrated will be accommodated from within the existing budget.

5 COMMUNITY SAFETY

5.1 The District Council as the Licensing Authority has a duty to ensure that there is a safe, secure and confident 'taxi' service provided for the public.

1.0	Andrew Martin of Fenland Taxis	Please can the licensing committee consider a change to the proposed new tariff that has been proposed in the paper as a driver in Wisbech for 22 years I feel that we need an extra rate for vehicles that hold more than 4 passengers and a booking fee arrangement for phone bookings that can be priced as we feel appropriate.	Section 65(1) of the Local Government (Misc. Provs.) Act 1976 – A district council may fix the rate or fares within the district as well for time as distance, and all other charges in connection the hire of a vehicle or with the arrangements for the hire of a vehicle, to be paid in respect of the hire of the hackney carriages by means of a Table of Fares made or varied in accordance with the provisions of this section.
		I have both a car and a minibus the new proposed as whole is good for cars that pick up from a taxi rank. The problem we have is when a customer rings to make a booking from a village location it won't be financially viable for taxi drivers to do jobs that do not come into Wisbech or go through Wisbech on the journey.	The principle features of a hackney carriage are: it can carry passengers for hire or reward; it can be hailed by a prospective passenger; and it can also park on a rank to await the approach of passengers. The philosophy behind this licensing is that each hackney carriage is individually controlled and is available for public hire. In practice, however, in many parts of the country, most hackney carriage activities are more akin to private hire vehicle activities than this traditional view of the hackney carriage would suggest.
		Mr. Martin goes on to give an example fare where he states he will potentially lose a total of £3.19 on the fare. Appendix A1 is a copy of the email from Mr. Martin.	The Byelaws and the reviewed licence conditions state that "when standing or plying for hire,the device (meter) fitted be locked in position in which no fare is recorded on the face of the taximeter". And "before beginning a journey for which a fare is charged for distance and time, bring the taximeter into actionso that the word 'HIRED' is legible on the face of the taximeter and keep the machinery of the taximeter in action until the termination of the

			hiring; Once a hackney carriage is plying for hire (whether cruising the streets or waiting on a rank), there are only a few reasons the driver can use to refuse to take a passenger and, once the vehicle has been hired, the hirer is then contractually bound to pay the fare as laid down in the Table of Fares set by the council.
2.0	Mrs. L Corbett of Bevs Taxis	I am writing this letter in regards to the new proposed Taxi Tariff I would like to raise an objection against this tariff for several reasons. 1) This now makes a 2 mile journey £5.30 up from £4.24. This is a 25% increase. People's budgets are stretched now and I do not think this is fair on behalf of the public to be possibly charged this greater increase. 2) I do not believe the booking fee should be done away with as this helps cushion the jobs from village to village i.e. Leverington to Gorefield. The 36p could be rounded up to 40p and then it would be up to the individual driver if they want to put a beeking fee an are	The Licensing Committee felt that the proposed increase would place Fenland around the middle banding of fares within the Councils Similar Basket of authorities as previously requested by the Trade. Section 54 of the 1847 Act allows agreement to be made in advance of the hiring of a hackney carriage that a sum less than that shown on the meter at the end of the hiring will be paid, and once such an agreement has been made it is an offence for the
		individual driver if they want to put a booking fee on or charge just 20p etc. At present Bevs Drivers work on a maximum of 19p booking fee and this has worked perfectly for us and the public.	proprietor or driver to demand more than was agreed in advance. This situation only covers specific occasions when the agreement is clearly made in advance, and does not cover the situation where, at the end of the hiring, the hirer either disputes the fare or does not have sufficient means of payment to cover the fare. In those cases, the fare itself is due under the contract entered into between the hirer and the driver or proprietor.

		3) As all Hackney Carriage taxi drivers have had meters fitted and all have to be in use from 1 April. This now means every cab would have to pay to have their meters recalibrated as well as losing the time ingoing over to March to have them resealed. I would like to see just a 4p increase on the booking fee and everything else stay the same as per the old tariff. The public need time to get used to having every taxi metered and the chance that the taxi driver will charge the full metered price without having a massive increase as well. A copy of the letter of response from Mrs. Corbett is at Appendix A2 .	Once a request is made from the trade for an increase to the Table of Fares, the legislation dictates a timescale of consultation and determination by Licensing Committee. The timing of the request is not within the Councils control. The meters will have to be recalibrated should the proposals go ahead. The Licensing Team have had discussions with the meter installers and have offered council facilities to enable complete days and timetabled vehicle visits as part of a negotiated fee for recalibration on behalf of drivers/owners should the tariff change.
3.0	David Patrick	I am writing this letter to object to the New Proposed Hackney Carriage Tariff in the strongest possible terms. What this tariff does on very many of the shorter journeys is to reduce the amount that can be charged. Predominately by far the largest volume of our work involves what I will call short haul journeys where the journey distance is likely to be less than 1.4miles Mr. Patrick goes on to outline some examples Larger Vehicles: yet again Fenland District Council have ignored the vehicles that carry more than four passengers i.e. licensed to carry 6 & 8 people. The result of the new tariff in this instance is particularly punitive in the decrease of earnings on those larger vehicles. Within our basket of Councils excluding Fenland 7 of those operate a special tariff for those vehicles when carrying more than 4 people this is normally an 50% extra of the tariff on normal time our tariff 2 and double at other times our tariff 3. tariff. Larger vehicles are used by larger families and groups wishing to travel together to either go shopping or local venues the councils new tariff hits the drivers of those vehicles particularly hard. A 6 seater licensed vehicle with 6 people will have to travel over 2.2 miles before he benefits from any increase in the New Council tariff and a vehicle licensed to carry 8 people with a full compliment will have to travel over 3.2 miles. So in effect any journeys under those distances will see our earnings eroded not increased. This effectively makes those vehicles non viable to run.

I would be more than happy to meet with licensing and licensing committee members to illustrate the problems.

Mileage increase: I believe that the increase in the mileage from £1.55 to £2.00 in one year to be too excessive and that those few people who travel greater distances have been very hard hit. I believe that for this year a rise to £1.80 would have been sufficient to be reviewed again next year.

Booking fees: are an essential part of our fare structure may I suggest you look at the tariff for Newark and Sherwood and Boston. It is to be argued that a booking fee is needed to counteract journeys where a long distance is travelled to undertake a short journey. Lets give an example of somebody in Murrow wanting to go to Parson Drove Surgery. No driver would accept that as a booking as by the time he has travelled from Wisbech to Murrow to pick up dropped at the Surgery and collected his fare and returned to Wisbech he will have used more fuel than the fare he has charged.

The reduction in distance from 1 mile and 2/5ths to 1 mile was added following a request from Mr Patrick last year.

The current Table of Fares shows Tariff 1 (07:00 – 23:00 hrs) 'flag' as £3.31 (1 mile and 2/5ths) with the proposed Tariff 1 fare (1 mile) as £3.30. All extras including a 36p booking fee were removed. See **Appendix B** for the existing and proposed Table of Fares.

4.0	Carrie Aylward, a local resident from March.	I would like to object to the revised table of fares. Last Thursday I took a taxi from station road to Neale Wade School for my daughters parents evening. I would expect this to cost between £3.50 to £4.00 as it has on previous occasions. Amazingly, due to waiting time, the meter showed a fare owning of nearly £9.00. The driver kindly reduced this to £7.00 but even so I feel this is excessive.	
		Licensing Officers investigated further as this fare did seem a little excessive. On investigating further this was Ms Aylward's reply: Thank you for your attention to this problem. No I didn't ask them to wait. We were caught in traffic in Creek Road by Sainsburys and the driver, who I must say was trying his best to be helpful – decided to go the by –pass route so I ended up going back down Station Road, Norwood Avenue, Robingoodfellows Lane, Maple Grove then Wisbech Road onto the bypass and down Knights End Road I really do not want to get the driver in trouble as I do not believe he was trying to rip me off and my elderly mum using him	A Taximeter will operate on time and distance. 5.0	Fenland Taxis (Mr. Andy Martin)	Additions to my letter (see response 1.0 above). Point 1: as a hackney carriage driver for 22 years in Wisbech I am concerned about the changes to the tariff you are trying to apply for us. I feel that changing the new tariff to 3.50 flag for 1 mile still but drop the price per mile down to 1.80 instead of 2.00 per mile as I feel this a very large jump this would lower the price on long journeys so the travelling public would still be able to afford to use taxis on long journeys.	The current Table of Fares shows Tariff 1 (07:00 – 23:00 hrs) 'flag' as £3.31 (1 mile and 2/5ths) with the proposed Tariff 1 fare (1 mile) as £3.30. 		Point 2: I feel we need a booking fee for journeys as explained above as some journeys would not work on a meter only and drivers would start refusing to do jobs that don't start end or go through Wisbech. I am writting this letter to object to the New Proposed Hackney Carriage Tariff in the strongest possible terms.

What this tariff does on very many of the shorter journeys is to reduce the amount that can be charged.

Predominately by far the largest volume of our work involves what I will call short haul journeys where the journey distance is likely to be less than 1.4 miles

Under the present tariff a journey of up to 1.39 miles the tariff is as follows on a booked journey £3.31 flag plus 36 pence booking fee plus 20p for every additional passenger over 2. So a vehicle with 4 people on board travelling up to 1.39 miles can command according to tariff a fare of £4.07. Under your new tariff the fare will be £4.10 an increase of 3p. However on journeys less than 1.19 miles all fares will decrease to a point where we will be up to 37p worse of on small journeys.

Removing all the extras will in fact see many of the journeys in town decrease in price to £3.30 rather than if booked the £3.67 that we can presently legally charge.

I WOULD LIKE TO OBJECT TO THE REVISED TABLE OF FARES. LAST THURSDAY I TOOK A TAXI FROM STATION ROAD TO NEALE WADE SCHOOL FOR MY DAUGHTERS PARENTS EVENING. I WOULD EXPECT THIS TO COST BETWEEN £3.50 TO £4.00 AS IT HAS ON PREVIOUS OCCASIONS. AMAZINGLY, DUE TO WAITING TIME, THE METER SHOWED A FARE OWING OF NEARLY £9.00. THE DRIVER KINDLY REDUCED THIS TO £7 BUT EVEN SO I FEEL THIS IS EXCESSIVE.

WITH THE LIKELIHOOD OF BUS CUTS IN THE NEAR FUTURE TAXIS MAY BE THE ONLY WAY FOR PEOPLE TO ACCESS LOCAL FACILITIES SUCH AS DODDINGTON HOSPITAL – I DREAD TO THINK HOW MUCH THAT WOULD COST.

Cost of taxi from Wisbech to leverington then on to gorefield could cost £ 10 - £11

For which we would only be able to get paid £4 - £5

As you can see we need a booking fee only to be applied on phone bookings (not to be used from a taxi rank)

POINT 2

I FEEL WE NEED A BOOKING FEE FOR JOURNEYS AS EXPLAINED ABOVE AS SOME JOURNEYS WOULD NOT WORK ON A METER ONLY AND DRIVERS WOULD START REFUSING TO DO JOBS THAT DON'T START END OR GO THROUGH WISBECH I DON'T THINK THERE WOULD BE ENOUGH PRIVATE HIRE VEHICLES TO COPE WITH THE DEMAND IF TAXIS STOP DOING THESE JOBS

NHS Non Emergency Patient Transport

Patients are responsible for getting themselves to and from non-urgent NHS appointments.

NHS Cambridgeshire funds patient transport only to those patients who have a medical need and have no alternative means of getting to and from hospital. Patient transport is arranged through your GP surgery and is subject to meeting certain medical needs.

Am I eligible?

Eligible patients are those:

- Where the medical condition of the patient would be harmful to the patient's condition or recovery if they were to travel by other means
- Where the patient's medical condition impacts on their mobility so that they would be unable to access healthcare by other means
- · A parent or guardian when children are being transported
- Patient transport could also be provided to a patient's escort or carer e.g. those accompanying a person with a physical or mental incapacity, vulnerable adults or to act as a translator. You must let your GP know if you require this service at time of booking transport so that it can be arranged for you.

Alternative Transport Arrangements

If you are not eligible for patient transport you will need to make your own travel arrangements. Alternative types of transport are listed in this booklet.

Help with travel costs
