I would like to raise an objection at the forthcoming licensing hearing for Haran's at 11/10 Norfolk Street Wisbech for the reason of public safety due to lack of cleanliness and out of date food and drink for sale. In addition there was evidence that the business is operating without a legal trade waste agreement.

On 19th June 2019 a number of regulatory officers carried out a number of adhoq inspections at various business premises in Norfolk St. The purpose of the action day was to provide support and assistance to business owners in relation to regulatory compliance, obtain up to date information relating to business activities and conduct health & safety inspections of the residential accommodation attached to the businesses.

There were 5 groups of officers including members from the council's Licensing, Streetscene, Environmental Health, Housing and ASB teams, together with staff from partner agencies such as Trading Standards, Fire Service and Police.

The report below has been submitted on behalf of the officers who attended the shop known as Harans at 10/11 Norfolk St.

I would like to raise an objection for the up and coming licensing hearing for Haran's at 11/10 Norfolk Street Wisbech for the reason of public safety, there is also an unlawful element in that the business is operating without a legal trade waste agreement so there is an element of crime and disorder. My reasons are below:

At the recent multi agency action day which took place on the 19th June there was evidence that the business is operating without adequate trade waste provisions. The shop floor and upstairs storage area was full of trade waste. The lady on the counter, Sarah Roe, advised that the manager Mr Thivakaran has told her that all rubbish should be bagged up and took up stairs. This was evident from what was observed and the shop store room was very smelly and there was evidence of an insect problem due to the sheer number of flies. The shop assistant advised that since at least January they have not had a trade waste collection. There were bags of rubbish all over the premises. The rear of the shop has a small rear access but I was not able to gain access to this at the time of the visit.

When an officer spoke to Mr Thivakarn he advised he had a contract arrangement with Booker whereby he takes his waste to them as and when required. For this he pays an annual fee. When asked when was the last time he had disposed of trade waste there, he advised '3 weeks ago' but he couldn't really recall the type of waste or produce any evidence of this. He advised he had all the paperwork for trade waste at his home.

On this day he was served with a formal Section 34 Notice which is a producer for trade waste. It was agreed that an officer would revisit to see his paperwork on the 19th July. He advised he was going to have a tidy up in the meantime.

On 9th July 2 other officers revisited the shop and enquired about the trade waste agreement at Harans and established that nothing had changed/improved since the day of action. At this stage a further revisit was arranged for the 23rd July so that the Streetscene Manager, Layna Warren could also be present. On returning on 23rd July the officers returned to the shop to find it was closed, despite having made the pre-booked appointment.

On the 1st August a further visit was attempted but officers were told the business was yet again closed for business. It is therefore the officer's decision to serve a fixed penalty notice in due course.

I was made aware that 2 colleagues had been to re visit the shop on the 9th July. They had asked about his trade waste, knowing I would be interested, and found this exactly as they had been before. At this time they agreed to revisit on the 23rd July so I agreed to go along with them on this date to see evidence of his trade waste. On this day we found the shop to be closed despite having a pre-arranged appointment to meet him.

On the 1st August I was going to re visit but was advised that the shop was closed. We aim to return with the outcome of issuing a FPN for failing to provide trade waste provisions.
