The Parade

Local groups are invited to join us in parading from the Bandstand in West End Park at 11.30am. Spectators can view the procession, which will be led by Newmarket Samba Band, as it passes the skate park onto Brewin Chase, into City Road Car Park and then back to West End Park. The parade will be led by the dragon and flanked by banners and pennants that have been created by March community groups and individuals with artists Ricki and Cary Outis.

Year 10 students from March's Neale Wade Academy will also be wearing spectacular head dresses that they have created with Mandinga Arts, who have contributed extraordinary and innovative

outdoor performance costumes, puppets and processions at many festivals and events across the UK and Europe including Notting Hill Carnival, Brighten Pride, STAMP Festival (Germany), and Aalborg Carnival (Denmark). Thanks go to Cambridgeshire Community Foundation and Fenland Culture Fund for grant funding to make this possible for the students.

Amusements
