

## Food Waste Recycling

All food waste can be recycled, cooked and uncooked



- Fruit and vegetables (including peelings)
- All uneaten food and plate scrapings
- All food scraps (including eggshells, bread, rice and pasta)
- All meat and fish (including bones)
- All dairy foods (such as cheese, eggs, yogurt)
- Teabags and coffee grounds
- Pet food

## Food Waste Recycling Tips

- ✓ Empty your kitchen caddy regularly to prevent smells
- ✓ Use a liner in your kitchen caddy to help keep it clean
- ✓ Leave anything hot to cool off before adding to your caddy
- ✓ Wash your kitchen caddy once a week or put it in the dishwasher
- ✗ Do not put liquids (such as milk, oil) in your caddy
- ✗ Do not put pet waste or litter in your caddy

## Blue Bin Recycling

Recyclables should be empty, clean and dry



- Plastic bottles
- Plastic pots, tubs and trays
- Metal tins and cans
- Aerosols
- Aluminium tin foil and trays
- All paper, cardboard, cartons (no shredded paper or tissues)
- Glass bottles and jars (including the lids)

## Blue Bin Recycling Tips

- ✓ Empty and rinse bottles, jars and cans before recycling
- ✓ Wash food packaging to prevent contamination
- ✓ Place items loosely in the bin, not in plastic bags
- ✓ Flatten materials, such as cardboard boxes and bottles to save space
- ✗ Do not put nappies or clothes in the blue bin
- ✗ Do not put vapes or batteries in your blue bin as they can cause fires!

## Garden Waste Service

Recycle your garden waste with a brown bin subscription



- Grass cuttings
- Leaves
- Weeds
- Hedge trimmings
- Small twigs and branches
- Plants and flowers (except invasive species like Japanese Knotweed)

## Garden Waste Recycling Tips

- ✓ Subscribe to the Garden Waste Recycling Service to enjoy hassle-free, fortnightly collections all year round!
- ✓ Prevent garden waste freezing solid in cold weather by loosening it with a spade before collection
- ✓ Share with neighbours – if you don't have much garden waste, you could share a bin or consider home composting
- ✓ Cut branches before putting them in your bin to save space
- ✗ Do not leave garden waste next to your bin for collection (apart from real Christmas trees in season)

## Green Bin Waste

Your green bin is for non-recyclable waste



- Tissues
- Disposable nappies
- Pet waste or litter
- Cigarette waste
- Polystyrene
- Shredded paper (it can't go in your blue bin; it jams the recycling machinery!)
- Any plastics that cannot be recycled in your blue bin, such as crisp packets

## Green Bin Tips

- ✓ Keep recyclables out – check if something can go in your food waste bin or blue bin before putting it in your green bin
- ✓ Bag it up – always put nappies, pet waste and messy items inside tied bags
- ✓ Avoid overfilling – the bin lid must close, otherwise your bin may not be emptied
- ✓ Extra waste? Take it to your local Household Recycling Centre
- ✗ Do not put hazardous waste (such as vapes, batteries, paint, gas canisters) or electricals in any household bin – take them to your local Household Recycling Centre

## General Recycling Tips

Easy ways to improve your recycling and reduce waste in your home

 This is a recycling symbol. It is applied to packaging collected by 75% or more of UK local authorities and then sorted, processed and recycled into new packaging or products.

 This is not a recycling symbol. 'The Green Dot' is used on packaging when its producer helps to fund the recycling of packaging in Europe.

 Textiles can be donated to clothing banks or charity shops to be reused or recycled. Did you know? £140m worth is binned every year in the UK – equating to around 350,000 tonnes!


 Need more room for your recycling? Order some free recycling sacks to leave out with your blue bin or an extra bin online at [www.fenland.gov.uk/bluebin](http://www.fenland.gov.uk/bluebin)

 Soft plastics, such as carrier bags, crisp packets and flexible film lids, can't be recycled in your blue bin – but they can at many supermarkets! Look out for soft plastic recycling points.

 Never bin vapes or batteries as they can cause fires! This includes batteries in mobiles and laptops, as well as standard household batteries.


## Household Recycling Centres

Cambridgeshire County Council operates the local Household Recycling Centres

You can take additional waste and recycling from your home to your local Household Recycling Centre. There are nine centres in Cambridgeshire, including in March, Whittlesey and Wisbech.

- Open 7 days a week (check online for opening times)
- Restrictions apply on vehicles and certain waste types
- Special collection points for electricals and batteries
